CONTRAST





Contrast is the latest work by Tupa Ruja, released on February 25, 2025 for Filibusta Records.

An album where each song has an expressive texture substantially different from the others, but is united by the intent to combine suggestions, intense emotions, with sound nuances of various kinds, to make languages, rhythms and musical characteristics of different cultures, geographically distant from each other, coexist.

An existential journey, which lays the foundations in an autobiographical research into feeling, in which the author and composer Martina Lupi outlines the expressive traits of her eclectic and multifaceted personality. The expressive form is then made possible by the intertwining and perfect fit with the musicians of the group: Fabio Gagliardi (founder of the group together with Martina Lupi) on didgeridoo and percussion; Stefano Vestrini on drums and percussion and Mattia Lotini on guitars.

The album's rich sound and expressiveness was contributed by guests of very high artistic importance: Javier Girotto on soprano sax and quena, Alessandro Gwis on piano, Marco Siniscalco on bass and Michele Gazich on violin.




The Tupa Ruja concert is a true "journey through sounds" that crosses times and cultures, bringing together instruments from different places and worlds, such as the didgeridoo (the traditional Australian Aboriginal instrument) and percussion from different parts of the world, which blend with multiple expressions of the voice, from improvisation to harmonic singing (typical of Mongolian culture), to original songs that rediscover languages and dialects belonging to Mediterranean cultures and with the intense and at the same time delicate sounds of the bouzouki and the guitar.





BIO



Tupa Ruja was born as a duo in 2006 from the desire of both the singer, songwriter and composer Martina Lupi and the multi-instrumentalist Fabio Gagliardi to give life to an experimental musical genre, but one that was rooted in ancient sounds.

Over the years they have brought their music to important stages around Italy and Europe: Auditorium Parco della Musica (Rome), (s)Nodi - Festival di Musica Inconsueta (Bologna), Australisches Sonntag - Didgeridoo Festival (Berlin) - Ethnos Festival (Naples), Accademia Filarmonica Romana, Ethno Jazz Night - Cavea dell'Auditorium (Rome), Festival della Musica Etnica di Civitavecchia, Wine Festival (Skopje), Portugal Tour - 2° Feira Internacional Patrimònio (Elvas) – Onda Jazz (Lisbona) – Centro de Artes e Espectàculos (Sever Do Vouga) – Cine Teatro de Condeixa (Condeixa A Nova), Casa del Jazz (Roma), Didjin'oz Festival – Festival internazionale del didgeridoo (Forlimpopoli), Folkest (Spilimbergo)...and many others. From 2017 to 2021 they collaborated with pianist Alessandro Gwis, with whom they played throughout Italy and made an album.

In 2022 with the new quartet formation, they participated in the Alberto Cesa Award, winning the first prize and a tour financed by the Nuovo IMAIE.
